INTRODUCTION

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Fremont County School District #21, Fort Washakie

Emergencies, disasters, accidents, injuries, and crimes can occur without warning at any time. Being physically and psychologically prepared to handle unexpected emergencies is an individual as well as, an organizational responsibility.

This *Emergency Preparedness Manual* has been developed to assist in minimizing the negative effect from such events. Please read this manual thoroughly before an emergency occurs, become acquainted with the contents and keep this manual available for immediate reference. **DO NOT FILE THIS DOCUMENT!** Once you are familiar with the information enclosed, you will be better prepared to protect yourself, your students and your co-workers.

WHAT YOU CAN DO NOW TO PREPARE

- Emergency supplies are kept in the Nurse's Office.
- Keep this *Emergency Preparedness Manual* in a visible location in your office/classroom.
- Know the four (4) key Standard Response Protocol (SRP) actions.
- Become familiar with the quickest exit routes from your building.
- Locate the nearest fire extinguisher and pull station.
- Register for CPR, first-aid, crime prevention, or other safety training courses.

SUPPLIES FOR FCSD#21

- Current American National Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED Manual (Located in the Nurse's office)
- Staff should consider American National Red Cross First Aid and CPR/AED training
- > Portable stretcher
- ➤ Cot: Mattress with waterproof cover
- ➤ Blankets
- > Sink and paper towels
- Covered waste receptacle with disposable liners
- Bandages, scissors, tweezers, needles
- Digital Thermometer with disposable covers
- > Expendable supplies:
 - Sterile cotton-tipped applicators, individually packaged
 - Sterile adhesive compresses (1"x3"), individually wrapped, cotton balls
 - Sterile gauze squares (2"x2", 3"x3"), individually packaged.
 - Adhesive tape (1"with)
 - Gauze bandage (I" and 2" widths)
 - Splints (ling and short) •
 - Triangular bandages for sling
 - Tongue blades
 - 70% isopropyl alcohol
 - Safety pins
 - Soap (plain) or solution containing hexachlorophene
 - Disposable facial tissues
 - Paper towels
 - Eyedroppers
 - Disposable gloves (consider vinyl if latex allergy possible)
 - Pocket mask/face shield for CPR
 - One-ounce emergency supply of Ipecac (dated)

	IF AN EMERGENCY ARISES:
1.	Be sure the Principal or Principal Designee, and School Office is notified and help is summoned.
2.	Follow the guidelines outlined in this booklet and apply the Standard Response Protocols (SRP).
3.	Reassure your students; your own calm approach will help students follow instructions that could save lives during an emergency.
4.	Be prepared to react to instructions from law enforcement or school administration.
